A Word of Encouragement

Sacrifice is not easy by definition, Webster defines sacrifice as "to give up for the sake of something else." Sacrifice is done for the sake of something else or someone else. Being a living sacrifice is not a popular subject today. It's associated with giving up something that you value. When we speak of sacrificial giving, we are speaking about giving things like money, food, physical items, and intangible things like love. We speak of giving these things when it is not convenient or easy. There is power in giving to the Lord, there is power in sacrificing things and ourselves to the Lord. Giving something up is scary and sacrifice will always cost you (time, money, and emotions), but you can always trust God and His plan for you.

- What does someone give up to become an athlete? (junk food, free time, their homes if they have to train elsewhere) What might they get in return for their sacrifice? (Olympic medals, professional career, endorsements)
- What do missionaries give up to spread the gospel? (their homes, cultures, family, freedoms, money, favorite foods, etc.)
- What makes a sacrifice worthwhile?
- What does it look like to "offer our bodies as a living sacrifice"?
- What are some ways our family can make sacrifices for others?
